Invocation:

P: THE LORD IS RISEN!

C: HE IS RISEN INDEED! HALLELUJAH!

P: We rejoice this Day and celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ, in the Name of the Father who gave His only begotten Son; in the name of the Son who died for us and rose again on this day; and in the name of the Holy Spirit, who gives us faith to receive this glorious victory that our hearts may rejoice.

- 1. Jesus Christ Is risen today, Alleluia!
 Our triumphant holy day, Alleluia!
 Who did once upon the cross Alleluia!
 Suffer to redeem our loss. Alleluia!
- 2. Hymns of praise, then, let us sing Alleluia! Unto Christ, our heavenly King, Alleluia! Who endured the cross and grave Alleluia! Sinners to redeem and save. Alleluia!

- P: *Jesus said*, "I am the Living One, I was dead, and behold, I am alive forever and ever. Amen." (Rev. 1:18)
 - C: "Worthy is Christ, the Lamb who was slain, to receive power and riches and wisdom, and strength and honor and glory and blessing." (Rev. 5:12)
- P: "Christ, having been raised from the dead, dies no more;
 - C: Death no longer has dominion over Him." (Rom 6:9)
- P: "Christ was delivered because of our offenses,
 - C: And raised again because of our justification." (Rom. 4:25)
- P: The Lord is risen! Hallelujah, Hallelujah!
 - C: He is risen indeed! Hallelujah!

SING: Hymn 188

Halleluia! Jesus Lives! He is now the Living One; From the gloomy house of death forth the Conqueror has gone, Bright Forerunner to the skies of His people, yet to rise.

Confession of Sins: Selected verses from Eph. 2

- P: "God, who is rich in mercy, because of His great love with which He loved us, even when we were dead in trespasses,
 - C: Made us alive together with Christ (by grace you have been saved,)
- P: And raised us up together, and made us sit together in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus,
 - C: That in the ages to come He might show the exceeding riches of His grace in His kindness toward us in Christ Jesus.
- P: For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, not of works, lest anyone should boast." Let each of us pour out our hearts before God and find comfort in His mercy ...
 - C: Have mercy upon me, O God, According to Your lovingkindness; According to the multitude of Your tender mercies, Blot out my transgressions. Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin. For I acknowledge my transgressions, and my sin is always before me. Against You, You only, have I sinned, and done this evil in Your sight. (Ps. 51:1-4)
- P: Through our Savior Jesus Christ, the Lord has purged us with hyssop, we are clean. He has washed us thoroughly from all our sins, and we are whiter than snow. May the joy and gladness of Christ's forgiveness comfort and assure your hearts of His abiding love for you.

Jesus lives! Let all rejoice; Praise Him, ransomed ones of earth.

Praise Him in a nobler song, Cherubim of heavenly birth.

Praise the Victor-King, whose sway Sin and death and hell obey.

Faith Responds in love: Adapted from Romans 6:4-13

- P: "Therefore we were buried with Him through baptism into death, that just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father,
 - C: Even so we also should walk in newness of life.
- P: For if we have been united together in the likeness of His death,
 - C: Certainly we also shall be in the likeness of His resurrection,
- P: Knowing this, that our old man was crucified with Him, that the body of sin might be done away with;
 - C: That we should no longer be slaves of sin. For he who has died has been freed from sin.
- P: Now if we died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with Him, knowing that Christ, having been raised from the dead, dies no more.
 - C: Death no longer has dominion over Him.
- P: For the death that He died, He died to sin once for all;
 - C: But the life that He lives, He lives to God.
- P: Likewise you also, consider yourselves to be dead indeed to sin,
 - C: But alive to God in Christ Jesus our Lord.
- P: Therefore do not let sin reign in your mortal body, that you should obey it in its lusts. And do not present your members as instruments of unrighteousness to sin."
- C: We will present ourselves to God as being alive from the dead, and our members as instruments of righteousness to God.

SING: Hymn 188

Jesus lives! To Him my heart Draws with ever new delight. Earthly vanities, depart, Hinder not my heavenward flight. Let this spirit ever rise To its magnet in the skies.

Scripture Readings: 1 Corinthians 15:1-11
15 Now I would remind you, brothers, of the gospel I preached to you, which you received, in which you stand, 2 and by which you are being saved, if you hold fast to the word I preached to you—unless you believed in vain. 3 For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with

the Scriptures, 4 that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures, 5 and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. 6 Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have fallen asleep. 7 Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. 8 Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me. 9 For I am the least of the apostles, unworthy to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. 10 But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me was not in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them, though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me. 11 Whether then it was I or they, so we preach and so you believed.

Matthew 28:1-15

28 Now after the Sabbath, as the first day of the week began to dawn, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary came to see the tomb. 2 And behold, there was a great earthquake; for an angel of the Lord descended from heaven, and came and rolled back the stone from the door, and sat on it. 3 His countenance was like lightning, and his clothing as white as snow. 4 And the guards shook for fear of him, and became like dead men.

5 But the angel answered and said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. 6 He is not here; for He is risen, as He said. Come, see the place where the Lord lay. 7 And go quickly and tell His disciples that He is risen from the dead, and

indeed He is going before you into Galilee; there you will see Him. Behold, I have told you."

- 8 So they went out quickly from the tomb with fear and great joy, and ran to bring His disciples word.
- 9 And as they went to tell His disciples, behold, Jesus met them, saying, "Rejoice!" So they came and held Him by the feet and worshiped Him. 10 Then Jesus said to them, "Do not be afraid. Go and tell My brethren to go to Galilee, and there they will see Me."
- 11 Now while they were going, behold, some of the guard came into the city and reported to the chief priests all the things that had happened. 12 When they had assembled with the elders and consulted together, they gave a large sum of money to the soldiers, 13 saying, "Tell them, 'His disciples came at night and stole Him away while we slept.' 14 And if this comes to the governor's ears, we will appease him and make you secure." 15 So they took the money and did as they were instructed; and this saying is commonly reported among the Jews until this day.

SING: Hymn 188

Jesus Iives! And thus, my soul, Life eternal waits for thee; Joined to Him, thy living Head, Where He is, thou, too, shalt be; With Himself, at His right hand, Victor over death shalt stand.

Confession of Faith: Luther's Explanation to the 2^{nd} article with our response of faith.

P: I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true Man, born of the Virgin Mary, is my Lord;

C: I rejoice in those words, He "is MY Lord." He rules my life. Therefore I will submit myself to Him; let His word guide me

daily; and trust His Holy Spirit to teach me, to open my mind and my heart to believe and truly trust everything He says.

P: He has redeemed me, a lost and condemned creature, purchased and won me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil, not with gold or silver, but with His holy, precious blood and with His innocent sufferings and death;

C: Yes, Jesus died for ME! Hallelujah! He drank the bitter cup of God's wrath against my sins so that I do not ever have to fear His wrath. Therefore I can live every day with joy and confidence, because I know that I am safe in God's hands. Whatever troubles may come, it is not because God is angry with me, or has forgotten me. God promises to be with me through them all, therefore I will not fear.

P: That I should be His own, and live under Him in His Kingdom, and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness; EVEN AS HE IS RISEN FROM DEATH, LIVES AND REIGNS TO ALL ETERNITY. THIS IS MOST CERTAINLY TRUE!

C: Oh, the joy this gives me, I belong to Him. So I don't want to live any longer for myself but I live for Him who died for me and rose again. Yes, I will find ways to serve Him every day, serve Him with joy and gladness, knowing that I will be with Him forever. This is most certainly true.

P: I Know that my Redeemer lives

C: And that He shall stand at the Last Day on the earth;

P: And after my skin is destroyed, this I know:

C: That in my flesh I shall see God,

P: Whom I shall see for myself, and my eyes shall behold

C: And not another. How my heart yearns within me! (Job 19:25-27)

Easter Message

Text: 1 Corinthians 15:12-23

12 Now if Christ is preached that He has been raised from the dead, how do some among you say that there is no resurrection of the dead? 13 But if there is no resurrection of the dead, then Christ is not risen. 14 And if Christ is not risen, then our preaching is empty and your faith is also empty. 15 Yes, and we are found false witnesses of God, because we have testified of God that He raised up Christ, whom He did not raise up —if in fact the dead do not rise. 16 For if the dead do not rise, then Christ is not risen. 17 And if Christ is not risen, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins! 18 Then also those who have fallen asleep in Christ have perished. 19 If in this life only we have hope in Christ, we are of all men the most pitiable.

20 But now Christ is risen from the dead, and has become the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. 21 For since by man came death, by Man also came the resurrection of the dead. 22 For as in Adam all die, even so in Christ all shall be made alive. 23 But each one in his own order: Christ the firstfruits, afterward those who are Christ's at His coming.

Cong: AND LEAD US NOT INTO TEMPTATION,


Pastor: From the leaven within and the temptations around us, deliver and keep us, good Lord.
