Renew my heart by the working of Your Holy Spirit so that I may present my body as a living and holy sacrifice, acceptable to You, which is my spiritual service of worship.

P: Be of good cheer, children of God, for our Father is forever merciful! The blood of Jesus Christ, His Son, cleanses us from all our sins, for Christ loves us and gave Himself up for us, that He might sanctify and cleanse us. We are now holy and blameless before God and our worship is pleasing to Him.

God Speaks to Us

Old Testament Reading: Ezekiel 2:1-5

2 And He said to me, "Son of man, stand on your feet, and I will speak to you." 2 Then the Spirit entered me when He spoke to me, and set me on my feet; and I heard Him who spoke to me. 3 And He said to me: "Son of man, I am sending you to the children of Israel, to a rebellious nation that has rebelled against Me; they and their fathers have transgressed against Me to this very day. 4 For they are impudent and stubborn children. I am sending you to them, and you shall say to them, 'Thus says the Lord God.' 5 As for them, whether they hear or whether they refuse—for they are a rebellious house—yet they will know that a prophet has been among them.

Epistle Reading: Romans 10:9 - 17

9 If you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. 10 For with the heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation. 11 For the Scripture says, "Whoever believes on Him will not be put to shame." 12 For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek, for the same Lord over all is rich to all who call upon Him. 13 For "whoever calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved."


14 How then shall they call on Him in whom they have not believed? And how shall they believe in Him of whom they have not heard? And how shall they hear without a preacher? 15 And how shall they preach unless they are sent? As it is written: "How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the gospel of peace, who bring glad tidings of good things!"

16 But they have not all obeyed the gospel. For Isaiah says, "Lord, who has believed our report?" 17 So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God.

Confession of Faith: The Nicene Creed

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.




Prayers of the Church:

The CLSU is a church body made up of 18 congregations and several preaching stations as well as a fully operational Seminary. They broke away from the Lutheran Church Uganda, a LC-MS affiliate because of the false teachings in the Missouri Synod. After several days of discussions with their pastors, it was determined that we are in full agreement and they have been recommended for fellowship with the CLC.

The Deepest Stroke that Pierced Him

Justice—we demand it when we are wronged, we uphold it when we see another doing wrong, and we are too ready to abandon it when it points a finger of blame in our direction. But what happens when justice itself is turned upside down? What happens when the innocent is condemned and the guilty go free? What if the greatest act of injustice the world has ever known was, in fact, the very stroke by which divine justice saved us all?

This Lenten season, we invite you to walk the path of Jesus, the Man of Sorrows, as He stands before earthly courts, suffers the cruelty of sinful human men, and submits to the perfect justice of God on our behalf. The trials of Jesus were marked by treachery, deceit, corruption, and injustice—but they were also the means by which God's justice was carried out, not against the accused, but on behalf of the truly guilty. In this great reversal, the Innocent One bore the punishment of the guilty, and the guilty are granted the righteousness of the Innocent.

Through this series, we will explore the legal, historical, and theological depths of Christ's trial, conviction, and crucifixion, seeing how every moment

—even those shrouded in scandal and misbehaviour—was under the righteous hand of God, working for the acquittal of sinners. What men meant for evil, God used for the greatest good this world has ever known. Come, stand in the courtroom of history. Hear the false accusations, witness the unjust verdicts, and see how, in the end, the stroke that true justice gave became the stroke that brought us forgiveness, life, and salvation.
